



Statement of Intent for PSHE

Intent

At Southbroom Infant School PSHE is at the heart of what we do and we aim for our children to become independent, confident, healthy and responsible members of society as well as developing the 'whole child's' intellectual, moral, social, creative and spiritual education. PSHE is taught across the school on a weekly basis and we follow the PSHE Jigsaw scheme. Alongside this we have our six school values- friendship, co-operation, resilience, honesty, respect and kindness - which form the basis of our 'Southbroom Way'.

We aim to provide children with appropriate vocabulary to discuss these values and themes.

We aim for the children to have the opportunity and willingness to try new things and persevere, to have a good understanding of how to stay safe, healthy and develop good relationships and to have an appreciation of what it means to be a positive member of a diverse, multicultural society.

Implementation

- We teach the National Curriculum and aim to enable all children regardless of ability and additional needs to flourish and become the best they can.
- The Jigsaw PSHE develops the 'whole child' through a spiral curriculum approach to developing knowledge, skills and understanding in the areas of Being me in my world, Celebrating difference, Dreams and goals, Healthy me, Relationships and Changing me.
- Use of NSPCC 'Pantosaurus' resources to support relationships teaching.
- Whole school assemblies to support the themes.
- Support from whole school themed weeks such as Health and Safety weeks.
- Support for families from our PSA, Zoe Pletts, and use of family Jigsaw.
- To become involved with activities in the community, e.g the Sidmouth Club, the Food bank and on a wider charitable scale, e.g Hello Yellow Day, Children in Need, which show empathy and compassion for others.
