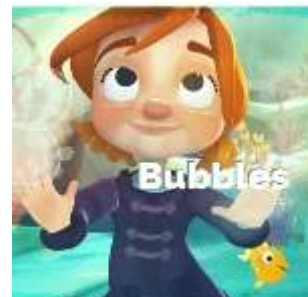

### **This term we will be covering:**

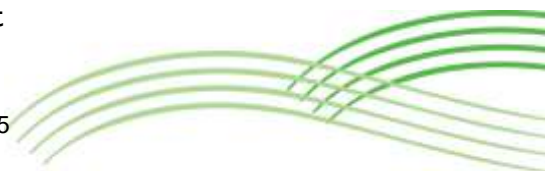
<b>Maths</b> Fractions Time Money  Application of the four operations- addition, subtraction, multiplication and division	<b>English</b> Reviewing basic grammar – capital letters and full stops Reinforcing letter formation Different sentence types – statement, question, exclamation, command We will be following a phonics and spelling programme. There will be an emphasis on introducing new vocabulary.  Text type – stories, poetry – riddles and nonsense rhymes.  As well as individual reading there will be class guided reading with a focus on non-fiction, retrieval of information and inference.
<b><u>Themed learning</u></b> Computing: Programming using Beebots. – investigating the way algorithms need clear instructions to work, solving problems, improve algorithms, using debugging skills such as checking back through their plans Science: identify and name a variety of plants, find out and describe how plants need water, light and a suitable temperature to grow and stay healthy. Observe and describe how seeds and bulbs grow into mature plants. Geography :Name and locate the world's 7 continents and 5 oceans. use world maps, atlases and globes to identify the United Kingdom and its countries, as well as other countries, the continents and oceans Use simple compass directions (north, south, east and west) and locational and directional language [for example, near and far, left and right], to describe the location of features and routes on a map. DT – Design a bag for an explorer
